
Local Shelters & CoC Agencies that can help with applications and referrals:



Top 3 Healthcare Options

- 1. Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs)
- · Free or low-cost care: medical, dental, mental health
- No insurance or ID required
- 2. Medicaid (Florida)
- Free health insurance for low-income individuals
- · Covers doctor visits, prescriptions, mental health
- · Apply at: ACCESS Florida
- 3. Emergency Rooms & County Clinics
- · Emergency care is always available
- County clinics offer sliding-scale services

How to Get Medicaid

- Florida resident
- Income below federal poverty level
- · Homeless individuals qualify

Step By Step Guide to Apply for SNAP



Steps to Apply:

- 1. Visit ACCESS Florida
- 2. Create an account and start a Medicaid application
- 3. Use shelter address or general delivery if needed
- 4. Upload any documents you have (ID, proof of income or homeless verification letter)

Need Help?

Ask a shelter staff member or social worker for assistance.

Homeless Verification Letter

Why You Need It:

 Required for Medicaid, SNAP, housing, grants

Who Can Write It:

- · Shelter staff
- · Outreach workers
- · Social service agencies
- · Continuum of Care (CoC) lead agencies

What It Should Include:

- Your name
- Statement confirming homelessness
- Dates and location
- Signature and contact info of agency

Apply for SNAP- Food Assistance

What SNAP Covers:

- Groceries
- · Seeds/plants for growing food
- · Discounts at museums and zoos

How to Apply:

- · Online: ACCESS Florida SNAP
- Phone interview required
- Use shelter or general delivery address

Tips:

- · Apply even with no income
- You may qualify for expedited benefits

Ask Local Shelters or CoC Agencies

They can help with applications and referrals

Are Marketplace Plans an Option? Marketplace (ACA) Plans:

- · May offer low-cost or free premiums
- Must earns at least \$14.580/year for subsidies
- Homeless individuals with no income may not qualify

Caution:

- Some agents may fraudulently enroll homeless individuals
- This can disqualify you from hospital charity programs
